We had an amazing opportunity to end our camping season with our annual Ladies Blueberry Retreat. We were confident that God was ready to do amazing things in the lives of those attending. Much **prayer** went into this retreat!

This weekend featured something new -story ropes and small groups. The story ropes were created by and for each lady to tell her story... including the most important events and people in her life. This tool allowed women to share things from their lives that included deep hurts. Many women said, "I've never told anyone about this" and many of those stories included the deep wound of sexual abuse. The first night the women were introduced to the concept and then invited to create their own story ropes. Then the next day, we were divided into small groups where we got to share our story ropes. I was amazed to

we got to share our story ropes. I was amazed to see how these ropes were like an open door to their hearts, allowing them to tell us about their family of origin, their own children, and then those times where they had been incredibly wounded. One woman shared how she went outside into the winter cold after being sexually abused as a young child. She wanted to die there, but in the end, went elsewhere for help for her frozen legs. She's been carrying the secret of this abuse for decades and now, having shared it felt great peace. She told me, "I can't stop smiling!" Another woman told me about her story rope. It was packed away, so she had to just describe it to me, but she did. She told me the color of each piece of fabric or ribbon and what it represented. This young woman has experienced domestic violence that has been so bad that she attempted suicide twice. She now has found purpose in staying alive for her three children. The small groups were very useful for allowing the women to share their hearts with each other and to **pray** together. Each of them realized that Jesus Christ could ultimately heal their wounds and give them hope, peace and strength. **Pray** for these ladies. We want them to understand God is still writing their story. He is the great Healer and Burden-Bearer.

Some women came for the first time and were so amazed with all that they saw and heard at the retreat. I was at the plane when one lady arrived. Her best friend had told her that she would love Kako and she did. Before she took more than five steps out of the plane she said "I love it here! I know I won't want to leave!" Indeed, she was willing to be on the last plane home!

Another gal, a young woman told me that she had been told by several people in her village "You should go Kako!" So at the last minute she quickly packed a bag and came. She told me several times that it was 'out of the blue' that she came. I couldn't help thinking that she was one of those who had been **prayed** here! I talked to her many times over the stay and she was so glad that she came. Ultimately it became clear to me that the Lord had a special purpose for her.

A number of elderly women came. Our house near the lodge where we have our 'elders' stay was full, and we wished for more rooms in this house so we could house more. One dear older lady over 80 who was tiny and bent over told everyone at the meeting, speaking in "Eskimo," that she was glad she came to Kako for the first time. She was amazed how they take care of everything, "...even the food and a blanket over my head." (for sleeping of course :-)) She was loved and embraced by all of us.

More comments from a number of the ladies about the retreat:

For me it was amazing! It's comfortable and inviting.

Everyone at home is struggling. We don't show it on our faces, but we are struggling. We leave feeling close to God, knowing He is writing our story. All things work together for good!

Kako is safe.... sober and drug free. So thankful for the fellowship... we don't have this back home.

The blueberries are so important for us to take back to our villages.

Thank you all for your prayers for God's work at Kako this past summer. It was amazing to see hearts being touched and transformed by the Lord. God bless you! Jeanne Rodkey

MISSION UPDATE AND PRAYER GUIDE




This past year, sign language Bible translation events were held for the Tamil Nadu people of India. A dozen local translators collaborated with four interpreters to complete 12 chapters of Luke in the first week alone. Praise God! To date, the books of Mark, Jonah and all three books of John have been translated into Tamil Sign Language - and the team continues to forge ahead.

One of the many fruits of this labor is the opening of the first Deaf Church in Tamil Nadu where 20 people now gather every week to worship. How exciting it will be to see this tiny church blossom as God's word is revealed through sign language. Let's **pray** with *urgency* for the people who *urgently* need God's Word in their own unique language.

<u>The UNITED STATES</u> - Faith Bible Church FBC, located on Route 417 in Little Genesee, NY, celebrated 50 years of ministry on August 11. Dave had the privilege of attending and sharing words of encouragement with the congregation and guests. Dave was Pastor at Faith Bible from 1987 to 1991. Praise the Lord! Thank you for your unending prayers for us. My brothers and sisters it is with great pleasure to be awake right now this night while others are sleeping just thanking God for the way He is using you to bless our ministry. I have funds with me now to send-off the student pastors on assignment in 17 ministry stations as they roundup on Sunday August 12 to begin school the next day. The old Toyota service vehicle has been wonderfully refurbished. This has been a great blessing for us. No matter how I am hailed in ministry that story can never go through without the input of my Heritage AFlame family in the USA. Thank you immensely. **Pray** for me as I join a national minister's conference not as a speaker again but with a deep determination to be refreshed by others. *Saints of God we must all beware. We are the temple of the Holy Spirit. Holiness is not an option. It is not right for us to presume on God's grace after all that Jesus did for us on that rugged cross where God's wrath was poured out on His Son for us!*
