
This message is to inform you of some latest happenings in Cameroon now.

- 1. The 35 years president of Cameroon is to continue for the next 7 years again.
- 2. The soldiers are bent to neutralize the armed civilians but these armed civilians are also using sophisticated guns and what they call guerilla tactics. They block free circulation of vehicles and battle with soldiers.
- **3**. This kind of gun exchange led to the death of an American missionary on October 30 2018 in the person of *Charles Trumann Chesco*. Please pray for his family and team here in Cameroon. This is why we could not bring you here for the conference at this time.
- **4.** Civilians are living in fear. The attached pictures are a sample of the disorder we are facing.
- **5.** I spoke and **prayed** with the Divisional Officer in our region who is really panicking because of the turmoil. He has promised to give us the authorization on Monday. This will give us final permission to hold the conference. In spite of the bloodshed we are bold enough to believe that God will give us His unparalleled favor. This is not a time for the church to retreat. We must preach, teach and **pray** with urgency.
- **6.** Thank you so much for the support you sent last month. With the current danger we could only withdraw small amounts at a time. It has enabled us to do the ministry and also to assist other pastors and teams with outreach projects. Please give our gratitude to all the believers there.

Greetings to you all, On October 8, 2018 I celebrated my 88th birth-day here in Washington with my family at a dinner prepared by my daughter Deb. It was a joyous occasion. Where does the time go? I have been here at Warm Beach Senior community for one year. It has been a good year and I have much for which to praise God. He has been so faithful!

Kako continues to have a special place in my heart. Please let me recap my adventures this past summer. I went back to KRC for our annual Family Retreat over Memorial Day weekend. It was a wonderful retreat. About 93 people attended. They all had to be flown in from the surrounding villages. Jordan Taylor and John Troyer were the pilots for this camp. So thankful for John and Becky Erickson and Jeanne Rodkey who prepared Kako for this event. A big undertaking as Jonathan and Sharon were in upstate New York awaiting the birth of a little brother for Merrick. We were blessed to have DJ Angaiak, a Yupik Eskimo, his wife Robin and two of their daugh-

ters share their story. They had been a broken family but God brought them healing. They shared their lives, being very transparent about their past failures and how they were able to change by choosing carefully to follow God with their lives. Their gals shared their own stories and songs which was an added blessing. They loved being at Kako. They could also see how the native people appreciated feeling safe and loved at Kako.

Sandwiched in between this Family Camp and our annual Ladies Berry Picking Retreat, were six weeks of Kids' Camp. I praise God for His faithful provision. With Kyle's passing, John and Becky Erickson took on the challenging role of leading the entire camping program. Each of the six week camps had 40 or more kids giving us a total of 255 campers. John passionately spoke during the Bible times on "How Big is Our God". The Gospel was clearly communicated and over twenty kids made a profession of faith. God provided all the counselors and staff we needed. Andy Trevan, a pilot from England returned with his wife and two sons to serve as a family. It



was also a highlight to have Kyle's family involved, his brothers as counselors, playing the guitar and Ella's sister Mady stayed the whole time. They were a great encouragement.

I returned to Kako for their Annual Ladies Berry Picking Retreat the first weekend in August. This is one of my favorite retreats. Deb and I flew in early arriving July 24th to help get set up for this retreat. Other ladies joined us and come August 3rd we welcomed 46 ladies from the surrounding villages. Gary and Stacy Elliot from MATA were a great help. Gary flew MATA's 206 which along with Kako's 206 made all the difference fitting in some long flights. We were able to reach out further to the coastal villages with many first timers. This retreat was a huge blessing and featured something new--story ropes. Terri Schell and Cathy Beachy from WA and OK were experienced speakers. They are founders of an inner healing ministry for women called "His Story Ministries" and use a method where fabric ropes are made by each lady to help describe their story including events and people in their lives.

Thank you for your **prayers** for Kako. It is a joy to see the ministry continuing under the leadership of Jonathan and Sharon. They are rejoicing with the birth of Micah David born June 6th weighing in at 7lb 9oz, a little brother to Merrick. This has been a difficult year with many changes and problems with the infrastructure proving to be very costly. Please **pray** for God's provision.

Here at Warm Beach there have been opportunities for me to share my testimony and Kako's ministry. I spoke at a Christian Advocates Men's Breakfast on June 19th, which was open to all. Then July 22, at the Free Methodist Church in Stanwood to the adult Sunday School Class and also to the Alaska Yukon Fellowship held there on September 1. Folks are **praying** for the Kako ministry.

As I continue to serve as Kako's ambassador I deeply appreciate your financial support and your sincere **prayers** for me as I continue to serve our Lord. From Paul Kumar, India.... Praise the Lord! We have started a new sewing centre at Sarugudu Village which belongs to a tribal and hill area. The village pastor's name is John. He is running the church in a small hut house. This is an extremely poor area so this sewing centre will provide hope for many. At the beginning we have over 40 women, many of them widows and most of them from a Hindu background, ready to This sewing centre will teach the skill of sewing, embroidery and knitting. Once these skills are learned women will be having a source of income in their lives. Also during their learning period half an hour will be set aside for **prayer** and devotion time that will be led by the pastor. They will also learn Christian hymns and Pastor John will be presenting small messages regularly. We hope and **pray** that this first class of women will not only successfully complete the training but also our great desire is for many to receive Jesus as their Savior. Please pray for us! This is but one project of many we are currently doing. We thank you so much for your **prayers**, encouragements and great support

for us and our ministry. With your prayers and

financial help we are uplifting our hands and we are able to run this ministry and able to win the souls for the Kingdom of God. We are **praying** for your ministry and families to prosper more and more in days to come. God bless you all!
