

Mission to Konkabay, Guinea - Please pray for God's favor on this project!.....Jasper Williams, Liberia

To my Heritage family, I am privileged to share a report with you from one of our church planters, *Wilmot Walker*. In sharing this you will more fully understand what it takes to plant a church in areas that have been closed to the Gospel for years. Upon reading through this it is our desire that the Lord will stir your hearts to pray with more fervency and urgency. Thank you for collaborating with us. Thank you for encouraging us. Who are the Kakabes? Historical Background:

The Kakabes are aborigines of Kankalabe in Guinea who were originally Malinken, Bioma. Their ancestors fought a tribal war with the Fulani. The Fulani defeated them in the battle and became their slave masters. Due to the harshness of the Fulani the Kakabes decided to create a language that their slave drivers would not understand. The language they developed is Kakabe. Other tribes were brought from the Forest region and sold to the Fulani King as well. They quickly learned the "slave" language as well. Not only were the Kakabes forced into hard labor, but they were also forced into Islam. Although this happened long ago it is astonishing that these people are still under suppression today.

Why are we reaching out to them?

1. We want to study their culture and way of life so we gain greater knowledge as to how we can effectively take the Gospel to them.

2. Jesus died for their sins. They need to know Him as their Lord and Savior. (John 3:16) What if someone had not shared the Gospel with us?

3. Our Lord Jesus has mandated in the Great Commission that we are to go and make disciples of every nation. (*Matthew 28:19-20*)

How did we make contact with them?

We are always praying for the Holy Spirit's leading especially as it relates to planting a church where no other church exists. We heard their story. We were filled with great compassion for these people. We quickly came to agreement that we needed to respond to the Lord's stirring in our hearts. We knew it would be a long journey by car and motorbike. After several hours we arrived.

Our observations:

The condition of the roads were extremely poor. Two motorbikes broke down. We had to wait for a third one to reach us. It took us half a day to reach our target. Once in the area we were able to quickly ascertain



that there was no church in the entire region of Fouta Jallo which includes Dalaba to Kankalabe, including several towns and villages of the Kakabes.

We did discover one Christian, however he refused to identify with us for fear his neighbors would discover he is a believer and banish him from work and village society. We devised a way to talk with him without compromising him. (Yet after four days he felt it best we leave since he was sensing some were suspicious.) He confirmed that Christians are not allowed to gather for worship. As is the case in so many areas when Muslims convert to Christianity they are treated poorly and many times persecuted. We did find out that the government is open to organizations who provide education, medicine and fresh water for the people. (This could be the opening we need.) We also observed that even today the Fulani's consider the Kakabes to be subservient to them.

What God did while we were there:

The four days we spent in Kankalabe were marked by success. The Christian brother who met with

us directed us to the village of Thiro where we met with Alphonse. He was sympatric towards Christians but he himself was not born again. Alphonse's wife was a Christian who had been baptized while she was still in N'zerekore. As I was talking with them the Holy Spirit ignited my heart to share the Gospel with him and give him the opportunity to accept the Lord. He did! He repented of his sins and he accepted Christ. Alleluia! We read from the book of Acts chapter 8:26-32. After he read the passage, I asked him, "what is stopping you from being baptized". Immediately we made arrangement to baptize him the next day which was the 25th of January. An added bonus was having his sister, Angel, accept Christ as well. Both were baptized at the same time. Alphonse did not want us to leave his home.





After the baptism we met

Sala Musa, a Kakabe who leads over 30 persons in an association that has an agriculture project in Masaya. They shared their need to fence in land to prevent the cattle from eating the crops. They also told us about three major needs they have as a community: a medical clinic; a school; and a new agriculture project. We received official permission from the Sous Prefer (like a Chief) of Kankalabe to share our vision with the KAKABE. Ditanyan was called by the Sous Prefer (Mr. Sanor) to take us to all of the KAKABE villages in order to share our vision with them. I was very bold in telling Mr. Sanor that we are in his region to share the Gospel with

the Kakabes through loving them and **praying** for them. We shared our desire to work with them to see their children go to school, to have safe drinking water and to have good medical center. The Prefer was happy and approved. He said that we can only share the Gospel in the region if we assist them with these needs. If we can't help them with these tangible things we will meet up with strong resistance from the Fulani. Ditanyan (Kakabe spokesman) came to wish us well as we departed the region. Here are the names of KAKABE towns and villages around Kankalabe: Masaya, Sajoya, Sedebaya, Minguiya, Moudia, Borrya, Wansant, Fitadala, Madina, Nassauraulaya, Kouffa, Bouteya, and Kalya. **Please pray for them.**



What is the Lord saying to us now?

God has laid a burden on my heart to love the KAKABES and to do mission work among them. We believe the Lord is leading us to have a training center here in Conakry where we can bring key persons to disciple and train them for the work ahead. This will be intense training to prepare them for anti-Christian attitudes and opposition. As I have already stated in this report there are many challenges, including: The sharing of the Gospel is slow since 90 percent of the population are Muslims; The Fulani consider the KAKABES their slaves and would not want anyone dealing with them without their permission; and It is prohibited for a Christian to speak with a Muslim in private, all meetings

are done in the open. Yet we know "all things are possible for those who believe." Therefore we also believe the Lord is encouraging us to apply for a document from the Ministry of Internal Affairs and Religious Affairs to authenticate our mission.

Please pray for us!

Pray for an elementary School to be built for the KAKABES as soon as possible.
Pray that water wells be drilled in both the Fulani and Kakabe communities. (The Fulani are in authority and would not allow us have access to the KAKABES unless we help them with this kind of project.)
Pray for laborers to begin working with the KAKABES on the fencing agriculture project.
Pray that we obtain a vehicle for the travel this mission will require.
Pray that Bible and Gospel literature becomes available in the KAKABE dialect.

From Tantor Joseph, Cameroon....Dear brothers and sisters in America. More grace to you as you labor in God's vineyard. Accept our heartfelt gratitude for considering us in Cameroon fit to be benefiting from your constant ministry supports. To be frank, if God had never raised steady supporters like you for us, we would not have moved an inch in ministry. I first came in contact with you many years ago and all I could do was plead for Bibles and tracts so that I could go out into the street markets and distribute your gifts and preach the Gospel. We saw the Lord bring many to salvation. But now in these days your faithful **prayer** and financial support is being felt in churches and on the mission field. In the past few years alone, even in all the violence and turmoil here in Cameroon, our ministry footprint has grown drastically. We have organized Gospel rallies, conferences and crusades that have reached thousands. We have been able to support many struggling pastors. We have seen new churches form. God has given our ministry many fresh seminary students to send forth into the vineyard of our God. Thank you so much for having compassion.

January 2020 will be ending tomorrow and God has really worked through us. I will also share the lessons of the T.F.R (Training For Results) seminar. God willing, we shall be retiring a father who joined ministry with us at the age of 66 and has succeeded to groom a church which now has a fulltime minister. Please **pray** for him.
